WINDING THE WAY

Living a spiritual life with the help of Gerard Manley Hopkins and the Spiritual Exercises

15 – 17 MARCH 2019 HAYES CONFERENCE CENTRE, SWANWICK, DERBYSHIRE.

Our 2019 Conference takes as its theme an exploration of the poetry of Gerard Manley Hopkins and ways in which it was influenced by the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius of Loyola. Although the Spiritual Exercises was written in the sixteenth century, this small handbook for guides continues to be a primary source of wisdom and guidance in retreat work today. As a Jesuit priest, Gerard Manley Hopkins was both influenced and formed by Ignatian spirituality. Michael Kirwan SJ, who is our keynote speaker for the Conference, says: "...to anyone with a knowledge of the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises, it does not take long to recognise the Ignatian traces and inspiration in the poetry of Gerard Manley Hopkins". Michael will help us explore ways in which the themes of the Exercises appear in the poems. We hope that this exploration will deepen our appreciation of the poetry of Hopkins as a resource for prayer and reflection in our own lives and in the context of retreats and spiritual direction.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Michael Kirwan SJ is a British Jesuit priest, currently teaching and researching at the Loyola Institute at Trinity College, Dublin. For twenty years he taught at Heythrop



College, University of London. He is interested in the dialogue between theology and literature, and has also researched in political theology and the work of René Girard. For several years Michael has conducted a themed retreat at St Beuno's, 'mapping' the poems, especially the best-known sonnets, onto the Weeks of the *Exercises*, and generally exploring how our experience of the *Exercises* and of Hopkins' verse can enrich each other.

RETREAT ASSOCIATION CONFERENCE REPORT

SOUNDING THE SILENCE

Many members of the Catholic Spirituality Network joined with fellow members of the Retreat Association for the ecumenical Conference which takes place every three years. This year the Conference took Silence as its theme. Patron Graham Sparkes opened the Conference. His address took a line by R S Thomas as its title: *'within listening distance of the silence of God...'* This line set the tone for the Conference as we sought to explore the depths of both stillness and speech.

Sara Maitland contemplated the silence of the desert in relation to the Hebrew Scriptures; Peter Tyler explored mysticism and mindfulness; Malcolm Guite accompanied us into the threshold realms of death and bereavement: they all helped us listen closely to what 'the silence of God' was saying.

On the last morning our closing liturgy was creatively focused by resident artist Jacqui Lea of Hopeweavers, and ably led by Roman Catholic liturgist, Frances Novillo. A stream of participants came to the centre of the space to



voice prayers for those who are silenced in multiple ways. A net woven with blue cloth and containing 250 silver fish spilled from the platform onto the floor like a river.



During the liturgy a new icon that has been specially written for the Retreat Association by John Coleman was hallowed and processed. The icon depicts the scene in which the Samaritan woman meets Jesus by the well in St John's Gospel.

SPIRITUAL EXERCISES NETWORK CONFERENCE

THE SPIRITUAL EXERCISES IN A

FRACTURED WORLD

The Spiritual Exercises Network held their Conference at Hinsley Hall in Leeds. Three speakers explored the theme. Julia MacDonald, from St Bede's Pastoral Centre in York, opened with a cosmic perspective, linking the Exercises with the visionary ideas of Teilhard de Chardin, and indicating the urgent need to take ecology and the sacredness of the whole world as our starting-point. Edel McClean went back to the wise ways of the first companions of St Ignatius - the early Jesuits who took 'spiritual conversation' out into the streets and ordinary places of their world with great sensitivity and humility. Nick Austin SJ gave us an overview of competing contemporary moral perspectives and sought to root us in the traditions of the Church's ethical and social teaching.



CSN member, Shirley Taylor, created simple, reflective liturgies for the Conference. Each day included workshops, individual times of silence and small group work, and began and ended with shared times of prayer and reflection.
