RETREAT ASSOCIATION CONFERENCE REPORT

In June this year around 130 members of the Retreat Association gathered together again in person at the Hayes Conference Centre in Swanwick, Derbyshire. It was good to be back! This was the first in-person gathering since the pandemic — a chance to meet old and new friends from the wider ecumenical community of the Retreat Association.

We were treated to a kaleidoscopic array of speakers and workshops on the theme of 'Creative Encounters – Exploring Imaginative



Paths to God'. We heard talks on art, literature, film and poetry and found it hard to choose between multiple

workshops along the same lines.

Mark Oakley shared his favourite poems with us on one memorable evening, and on another many of us took midsummer walk together, gently meandering through the fields surrounding the Hayes.



Abbot Christopher Jamison OSB was there, proposing that 'True Story Telling is the Story of Life', and Christopher Chapman led workshops

on praying the parables and the garden as a place for soul. Textile artist, Jacqui Parkinson, created an evocative art space, and we were supported by contemplative liturgies during early morning worship sessions and in the main group.



Too many highlights to mention them all! For everyone the Conference is both a coming together and also a personal journey through the programme with time to reflect alone, network with others and share deeper conversations. It left me reflecting on ways in which the imagination is so often our gateway to God. In the words of William Blake:

"When the sun rises, do you not see a round disc of fire somewhat like a guinea?" Oh! no, no! I see an innumerable company of the heavenly host, crying, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty!"

We are newly announcing the opening of bookings for *Shorelines - Finding God at the Boundaries,* our 2026 Conference, to be held at the Franciscan Centre, Ladywell. We are delighted to be led by Christine Dodd, a member of our executive committee, and to be able to spend time at another of our member retreat centres.

I was recently fortunate to attend the closing Mass of the Cenacle in Liverpool. It has remained a beacon of faith, hope and love for almost 120 years. I am mindful of the many Cenacle Sisters who have served NRM, CNRS*, CSN and the Retreat Association over time and formed many of our members in the work of Spirituality.

In a world stretched by times of intense challenge, it is a privilege to know the ways of God and to appreciate all whose generosity enables us to continue to be a unique network, seeking God's Spirit in our time.

An important feature of our AGM is the election of the Executive Committee, and we are pleased this year to welcome new members. Deacon Keith Ballard from Liverpool brings connections to the National Diaconate Conference. Fr Oliver Barry OMI from the Oblate Retreat Centre in Crewe, and Sr Margaret Mattison from St Paul's in Selly Park have offered to be co-opted members for as much time as their congregational responsibilities allow. We are grateful to all the Executive, who work tirelessly to support the growth of the Network. We are especially grateful for the services of Eamonn Hamilton who keeps good track of our finances in these challenging changing times.

We feel a great sense of an encouraging future and a strong commitment to work together for a fruitful year – to be surprised by what God has in store for us.


